

# Phonovisual Flashcards Without Picture Clues

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## Note from Internet Publisher: Donald L. Potter

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I created these cards to use with my *Phonovisual Long Vowel First Remedial Reading Program*. The students will first study the Phonovisual Consonant and Vowel Charts that we purchase from the Phonovisual Company. We also use the Phonovisual Flashcards with the clue pictures. We purchase these from [www.phonovisual.com](http://www.phonovisual.com).

Once the students have mastered the Phonovisual Charts and Cards, they can use these cards without pictures for **testing** their knowledge of the symbols and for **increasing** their fluency. The success of the method requires an automatic recognition of the symbols. Secondary spellings are included on these cards since teenage and adult learners will use need them from the start.

The cards are numbered under two groupings: Consonants & Vowels. C1 = Consonant 1, etc. Vowels are numbered V-1, etc. One consonant sound /zh/ was added to the cards though is not on the chart. *Measure*, *treasure*, and *pleasure* are about the only frequent words using it.

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I made these cards for my own use. The more technically inclined teacher with a background in linguistics may find the linguistic description at the bottom of the cards useful. The terminology varies between the different schools of linguistics. I basically used the American School of Structural Linguistics that learned in my college class on becoming bilingual back in 1974 at the Sunset School of Missions in Lubbock, TX.

The ladies who created the Phonovisual Chart Method were first class linguists, with extensive experience with speech correction and working with the deaf. Their charts are linguistically organized for maximum effectiveness in teaching the English speech sound and their major spelling correspondences.
